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All names, including those of authors, should be written in original language.

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The title page should contain (a) the title of the article; (b) the first name, initials of other names, and the last name of each author (no academic degrees); (c) name of department(s) and institution(s) to which the work should be attributed; and name and address of author responsible for correspondence about the manuscript.

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Number references consecutively, in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text, by arabic numerals in parentheses (1). The titles of journals should be abbreviated according to the style used in Index Medicus. For references to manuscripts accepted but not yet published, designate the journal and add (in press). Information from manuscripts submitted but not yet accepted should be cited in *the text* as (unpublished observations).
